19 **2. CONSEQUENCES OF ENTRY OF ORDER OF PROTECTION**

21 Violation of this order by the [] respondent [] petitioner can have serious
22 consequences, including:

1 A. If you violate the terms of this order, you may be charged with a
2 misdemeanor, which is punishable by imprisonment of up to three hundred
3 sixty-four (364) days and a fine of up to one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or
4 both. You may be found in contempt of court.

5
6 B. If you are the spouse or former spouse of the other party, an individual who
7 ~~[lives]~~ cohabitates with or has ~~[lived]~~ cohabitated with the other party, or if
8 you and the other party have had a child together, federal law prohibits you
9 from possessing or transporting firearms or ammunition while this order is
10 in effect. If you have a firearm or ammunition, you should immediately
11 dispose of the firearm or ammunition. Violation of this law is a federal crime
12 punishable by imprisonment for up to ten (10) years and a fine of up to two
13 hundred fifty-thousand dollars (\$250,000).

14 C. If you are not a citizen of the United States, ~~[entry]~~ violation of this order may
15 have a negative effect on your application for residency or citizenship.

11 manner set forth above.

22 ~~respondent and are entitled to full faith and credit when certain procedural~~

1 requirements are met. Because the mutual Order of Protection will only issue
2 when a petition and counter-petition (or reversed-caption petition) are filed
3 and the court finds that both petitioner and respondent committed acts of
4 abuse, a mutual order will be entitled to full faith and credit pursuant to 18
5 U.S.C. Section 2265(c) and Section 40-13-6(D) NMSA 1978.

6
7 ~~3.~~ A mutual order may be entered only after a counter-petition has been filed
8 and a hearing conducted of which petitioner received actual notice and at
9 which petitioner had an opportunity to participate if 18 U.S.C. Section 922

5 **Committee commentary.** — The Family Violence Protection Act provides that "a peace
6 officer shall arrest without a warrant and take into custody a person whom the peace officer
7 has probable cause to believe has violated an order" of protection entered pursuant to the Act.
8 Section 40-13-6(C) NMSA 1978.

9

10 This statute would allow a warrantless misdemeanor arrest for conduct occurring
11 outside the presence of the officer and would not require exigent circumstances in addition
12 to probable cause. That a misdemeanor must occur in the presence of the arresting officer is
13 a long standing common law requirement for a warrantless misdemeanor arrest. *Eg. State v.*
14 *Luna*, 93 N.M. 773, 777, 606 P.2d 183, 187 (1980). The "exigent circumstances" requirement
15 is mandated by the New Mexico Constitution. *Campos v. State*, 117 N.M. 155, 159, 870 P.2d
16 117, 121 (1994) ("[F]or a warrantless arrest to be reasonable it must be based upon both
17 probable cause and sufficient exigent circumstances."). Absent the exigent circumstance that
18 the misdemeanor is committed in the presence of the officer, *id.*, ("If an officer observes the
19 person arrested committing a felony, exigency will be presumed."), the New Mexico
20 Constitution appears to bar blanket authority to make warrantless arrests for misdemeanors
21 committed outside the presence of the officer.

22

1 The legislature, of course, lacks power to provide by statute for an arrest procedure
2 that violates the New Mexico Constitution. *Campos v. State*, 117 N.M. 155, 158, 870 P.2d
3 117, 120 (1994). To avoid having the Supreme Court give approval to a form containing
4 language of questionable constitutional validity, the committee did not use the statutory
5 language in the portion of the [F]final [Θ]order describing the power of a law enforcement
6 officer to make a warrantless arrest for the misdemeanor crime (Section 40-13-6(D) NMSA
7 1978), of violating the [F]final [Θ]order of [P]protection. The committee substituted more
8 general language, which does not prejudge the constitutional issue.

9

10 The general provisions of the order of protection, including injunctive orders, "shall
11 continue until modified or rescinded . . . or until the court approves a subsequent consent
12 agreement. . . ." Section 40-13-6(B) NMSA 1978. In contrast, "[a]n order of protection . . .
13 involving custody or support shall be effective for a fixed period of time not to exceed six
14 months". *Id.* The custody or support "order may be extended for good cause upon motion .
15 . . for an additional period of time not to exceed six months", *id.*, unless "the order
16 supersedes or alters prior orders of the court" pertaining to child custody or child support. *See*
17 Section 40-13-5(C) NMSA 1978. In the latter situation, "the court may enter an initial order
18 of protection, but the portion of the order dealing with child custody or child support will
19 then be transferred to the court that has or continues to have jurisdiction over the pending or
20 prior custody or support action". *Id.*
